

Doctor 'runs over' homeless man, arrested

A 28-YEAR-OLD woman doctor was arrested by Delhi Police for allegedly running over a homeless man with her car in central Delhi's Paharganj, police said.

The woman told police that she was near a roundabout on Monday when the victim suddenly jumped in front of her car. However, an eyewitness told police that she was "driving rashly".

Police said the victim, a 35-year-old unidentified man, was dragged for several metres by the car after his blanket got caught in the wheels.

The woman is reportedly employed with a government hospital in central Delhi and lives with her husband at Greater Kailash Part I.

Police said she was granted bail and a case registered under IPC Sections 279 (rash driving or riding on a public way) and 304-(a) (causing death by negligence) at Paharganj police station.

The victim was taken to a local hospital where doctors declared him dead on arrival and shifted the body to a local mortuary, police said.

According to the FIR, the accident took place near the SDM office, located at DBG Road, on Monday.

The complainant in the case, Sanjay, who runs a scrap shop in the locality, claimed he saw the victim trying to cross the road when the car hit him.

In his statement, Sanjay claimed that the woman was driving the car at a high speed and in a rash manner.

After the accident, a crowd gathered at the spot, following which a PCR call was made. Police reached the spot and questioned the woman.

Police arrested her after the case was registered.

LAST YEAR SAW JUST 205 CASES

Till Jan 13, over 160 swine flu cases reported in city

DELHI HAS reported 168 cases of swine flu till January 13, as compared to just 11 cases reported till January 21 last year. As per data released by the Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP), a total of 205 people tested positive for the flu in the whole of 2018.

The most common strain, H1N1 — which was first reported in 2009 — is expected to be the strain this year as well. Initially recorded in 2009 in Mexico, the disease was declared a pandemic by the World Health Organisation (WHO) in 2010.

"Last year, the strain of the flu was H3N2. Both H3N2 and H1N1 cause similar disease... This year, there might be a minor drift. Since H1N1 caused a pandemic in 2009, now we are in the seasonal influenza strain," said Dr Shobha Broor, a former microbiologist at AIIMS.

Dr Atul Kakkar, senior consultant, department of internal medicine, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, said: "Cases are definitely on the higher side, but it is too early to predict the strain. The numbers may also be on the higher side this year due to extensive reporting of the disease by authorities. The dip in temperature can be one of the contributing factors to the higher numbers. We will need

to worry only if a new strain is detected."

So far this month, two suspected swine flu deaths were reported from Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital. The Centre-run hospital has seen 26 suspected cases of swine flu, of which two patients died and

four have been discharged.

Doctors said precautions should be taken such as frequent washing of hands and avoiding crowded places. Pregnant women, infants, the elderly and people who are on long-term medication or suffering from immuno-deficient conditions are most at risk.

"Those suffering from kidney- and heart-related ailments should stay extra cautious. It is important to maintain proper hygiene and avoid contact with any person having symptoms of swine flu," said Dr Jugal Kishore from the department of community medicine, Safdarjung Hospital.

The hospital has so far reported five confirmed cases of the disease.

The symptoms of swine flu are similar to that of a common cold and fever. It includes fever, cough, nasal secretion, fatigue, headache, body ache and sore throat.

The standard treatment for H1N1 is Tamiflu, which should be taken only on prescription. There are three categories of the virus — A, B and C. While the first two are considered stable, the third is dangerous and requires ventilator support immediately.

Husband, 3 sleuths held for 'spying' on woman

A WEST-DELHI based businessman was arrested Tuesday for allegedly employing three private detectives to spy on his wife as he didn't trust her.

The detectives were arrested from Chankyapuri Monday evening after the woman alleged that one of them was stalking her. "We have arrested the accused," said DCP (New Delhi district) Madhur Verma.

The incident came to light Monday evening when the woman approached the manager of a prominent hotel in Chanakyapuri, alleging that a man was stalking her. "The man was caught by security personnel... two of his associates were also apprehended," a senior police officer said. During questioning, they told police they were hired by the woman's husband.

Man held with bullet at CM house gets bail

New Delhi: The Delhi High Court has granted bail to a man who was arrested on November 26 last year for allegedly carrying a live bullet in his wallet while visiting the residence of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

Justice Sanjeev Sachdeva released 39-year-old Mohammad Imran on bail, after considering that he had been in custody for 55 days. The HC made it clear it was not commenting on the merits of the case. It granted bail to Imran, a caretaker of

a mosque in Karol Bagh and a resident of Seelampur, on furnishing a personal bond of Rs 25,000 and a surety of like amount. According to the prosecution, Imran was arrested after a bullet was allegedly found in his purse during frisking by security personnel.

The court said that he be released if not required in any other case, and directed that he shall not do anything that may prejudice the trial or the prosecution witnesses. PTI
